### CODE OF CONDUCT - YOUNG PEOPLE/JUNIORS

Church & Oswaldtwistle Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members. The Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents, carers or guardians associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with either their **age group team manager or Club Welfare Officer/ Junior Co-ordinator**, Graham Gaskill.

As a Junior Member of Church & Oswaldtwistle Cricket Club you are expected to abide by the following junior club rules:

- All members must show respect to all other members, coaches, team managers, administrators and parents
- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect opponents
- All members must, at all times when representing the Club, conduct themselves so as to ensure that the good reputation of Church & Oswaldtwistle Cricket Club is maintained
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager and as set out in the attached document.
- Members must pay any fees for membership, training or events promptly/by the due date. Failure to pay such fees will lead to the member being ineligible to attend training sessions and play in matches.
- All members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- All members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
